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November Spotlight: Assessments

Ongoing assessments:

Ongoing assessments are an integral part of the American educational system. Our students are taught to be responsible learner and do their best in every lesson.

Our teachers assess students on a daily basis – this helps them modify their lessons and provide differentiated activities for each child based on his/her current level of achievement.

Our ongoing assessments include performance tasks, teacher observations, student in-class participation, student work (writing journals, reading on RazKids, student reflection in Math and Science journals), and much more.

In KG (face to face and distance learning), students are mainly assessed during the lessons; the teacher explains certain concepts, students practice the concepts with the teacher and the teacher checks students' understanding of the concept by assigning certain activities during the week.

In Grade 1, these assessment practices are extended by short quizzes and assessments that children are required to complete. Students are also required to work on specific projects (for example STEAM Week) through which the teacher assesses students' abilities to demonstrate their understanding of a certain topic or a skill.

All ASCS staff will attend different Professional Development sessions during the week of December 13 – 17. These session are aimed at improving different skills and sharing best practice between all ASCS educators.
